

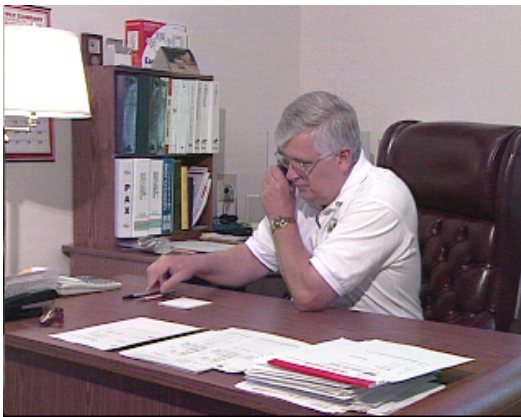

Biosecurity Protocols for Visitors and Service Personnel

1. **Purpose:** To prevent disease transmission from people
2. **Responsibility:** Farm Staff
3. **Frequency:** Daily
4. **Biosecurity Protocols**
 - 4.1 Farm visitors are people that are not farm staff or family. These include: service personnel (veterinarians and suppliers), off farm family members, neighbors, service crews (vaccination), etc.
 - 4.2 Farm visits are by appointment only

- 4.3 When coming onto the farm site the visitor must park their vehicle in the designated parking area
- 4.4 Visitors must be wearing clean clothing
- 4.5 Visitors are to report to the farm office and sign-in on the Visitor Log

- 4.6** Some facilities may require visitors to shower prior to entering the farm site CAZ. The farm would provide farm clothing for visitors to wear when on farm

- 4.7** Visitors are to put on biosecurity clothing in the TA of the CAZ

- 4.8** Visitors are to be accompanied by a farm staff member while on the farm site
4.9 Any equipment brought by visitors that will enter the CAZ must be sanitized prior to taking into the CAZ
4.10 At each barn TA, the visitor is to put on disposable boots in the barns TA and

remove and place in a garbage container when leaving the barns TA

- 4.11 Visitors are to sanitize their hands when entering and leaving a farm site TA
- 4.12 When going from one species of livestock/poultry to another, the visitor must change the biosecurity clothing in the barns TA
- 4.13 Any equipment taken into the CAZ must be sanitized prior to leaving the farm site

5. **Biosecurity Deviation Protocols**

- 5.1 If visitors have been on another farm prior to the visit the visitor should not be allowed entry to the farm site
- 5.2 If the visitor's vehicle or clothing are dirty or look contaminated, entry onto the farm site is not to be allowed
- 5.3 When disease is suspected on the farm site or on neighboring farms, no visitors are to be allowed onto the farm site

6. **Biosecurity Records**

Visitors Log
